The second addition, entitled "One Man's Search," depicts a man sitting on a bench reading a book and will be located in front of Huddles Frozen Yogurt in Sophia Square at 110 W. Main Street, Suite 115.

Once participants have followed all of the clues around the Arts & Design District, they will be registered to win a gift basket full of items from District businesses.
